- 1) The participants were welcomed by TRIUMF CEO Nigel Smith with the Land Acknowledgement.
- 2) WG9 chair Angela Bracco and Secretary Iris Dillmann also welcomed the participants. The minutes from the last meeting 2023 in Avignon/ France were approved. They can be found at https://wg9.triumf.ca/minutes.html
- 3) Changes in membership: Present and past membership lists can be found on the WG9 webpage at https://wg9.triumf.ca/about-us.html. Upcoming changes (2024/25) of the WG9 membership: Zhiyu Sun replaces Hushan Xu as new director of IMP Lazhou/ China; David Dean will replace Stuart Henderson as Director of Jefferson Lab/ USA; Alinka Lepine-Szily let us know that a new chair for ALAFNA will be elected soon; Eberhard Widmann will be the new chair of NUPECC, starting December 2024.
- 4) Angela Bracco reports from the IUPAP Executive Council (Oct. 3, 2023): (slides at https://indico.triumf.ca/event/519/contributions/5814/attachments/3959/5407/Per WG9 Vancouver v2.pptx) The new incoming IUPAP president is Silvina Ponce Dawson. The IUPAP office has been moved from Singapore to Trieste/ Italy. The UN General Assembly has adopted a new resolution proclaiming the International Decade of Science for Sustainable Development (2024-2033). New Working Groups were formed (WG18 WG on Ethics, WG19 WG on Quantum Science and Technology, WG20- WG on Open Science; WG21 WG on Physics for Climate Change Action and Sustainable Development); WG 16 Physics and Industry wants to become a commission. We as WG can send observers to other WGs (e.g. Navin Alahari who is in WG16 reporting back to us)- if anyone is interested, contact Angela.
- 5) One of the discussion points at the IUPAP General Assembly was a suggestion of restructuring of IUPAP Commissions and Working Groups. For example, WG should exist only for a limited time. For "transversal" WG like our WG9 or WG1 (ICFA) with long-term activities one would need a new category. An external evaluation committee has been asked to make suggestions about the

restructuring process. The summary will be presented at the next General Assembly in October 2024 in Haikou/ China. WG9 should be represented there – who can go?

- 6) Updates and/or Addendum for Report 41 (https://wg9.triumf.ca/report41.html): Addendum to the report that includes information on the topics related to the impact and societal impact of the Nuclear Physics facilities (see at the end of the minutes). Consider also adding executive summaries (2 pages) from strategic reports (NUPECC, NSAC, Canadian Subatomic Physics, ... etc.).
- 7) Next WG9/C12 meeting: During INPC2025; no Science Symposium in 2025, delay it by 1 year (to 2026) to wait for IUPAP restructuring and look for host in more central location- plan for 2 days, together with C12. Suggestion: IPAC2026 in Paris (tbc).
